Noteworthy Housing Legislation & Efforts for Local Control of Land Use & Zoning

Housing Terminology Abounds

HCD-Housing & Community Development, RHNA-Regional Housing Needs Allocation (currently in 6th Cycle), AMBAG-Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments, Housing Elements, General Plan, Objective Standards, Design Guidelines, Land Use, and Zoning

State Assembly and Senate Legislation – significant items

CA Code 65589.5-Housing Accountability Act (**Builders Remedy**) **SB35**-Housing Streamlined Ministerial Approval – signed 2017, **SB9**-Accessory Dwelling Units Ministerial – signed 9/16/2021, **SB10**-Housing Density – signed 9/16/2021,

AB215 - Planning & Zoning Law (RHNA penalties)—signed 9/28/2021, **SB423**-Land Use: Streamlines Housing Approvals and increases penalties if RHNA #'s are not fulfilled — signed 9/11/2023
